Legislative Report

The Illinois General Assembly is in session. The IFDCO is already monitoring bills. Notable bills include these:

HB1631 Animal Prosecution Advocate

Provides that in a prosecution of a case involving the injury, health, or safety of a cat or dog, the court may, on its own motion or motion of any party, appoint a special advocate to assist the court, as deemed appropriate by the court, and represent the interests of justice regarding the health or safety of the cat or dog. Amends the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois Department of Agriculture Law. Provides that the Department of Agriculture shall compile a <u>list comprised of pro bono attorneys and law students</u> from each county who may serve as special advocates for these cases.

HB1645 Misrepresentation Service Animal

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person commits <u>misrepresentation of a service animal</u> when he or she knowingly represents, expressly or impliedly, that the animal is a service animal for the purpose of securing the rights and privileges afforded to a person with a disability accompanied by a service animal and the person knew or should have known that the animal is not a service animal. <u>Provides that the refusal to answer questions from a law enforcement officer permitted under federal regulation creates a permissive inference that the animal is not a service animal and the law enforcement officer may require the person to remove the animal from the place of public accommodation. Misrepresentation of a service animal is a petty offense. Defines "service animal".</u>

SB0061 Animals - Administrative Fine

Increases administrative fines imposed by the Department of Agriculture for a violation of the Act. Increases fees for licenses issued under the Act. Provides that all fees, fines, and other money received by the Department under the Act shall be paid into the Department of Agriculture Animal Welfare Fund (rather than the General Revenue Fund)....Administrative fines shall be imposed by the Department upon any entity that violates the Act or any rule adopted by the Department under this Act: (1) for the first violation, a fine of \$3,000; (2) for a second violation that occurs within 2 years after the first violation, a fine of \$5,000; and (3) for a third violation that occurs within 3 years of the first violation a fine of \$10,000.
